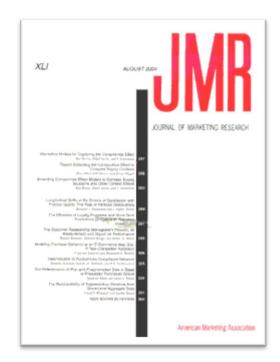

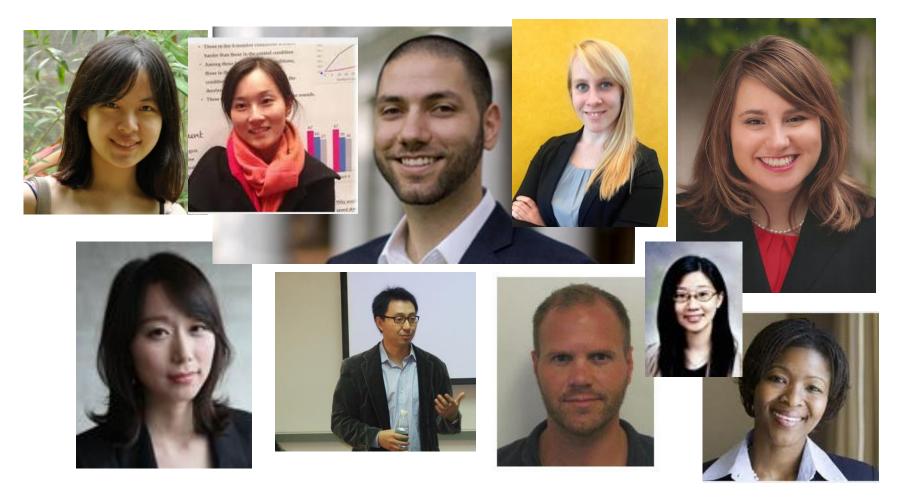

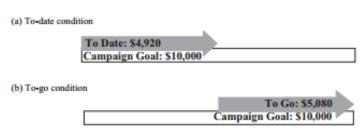
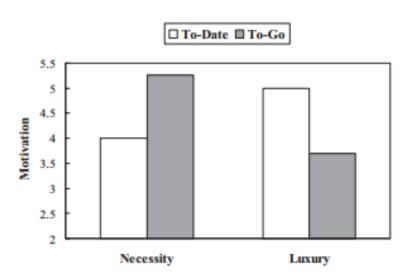


Figure 6. Compassion solicitation letter figures (Study 4).



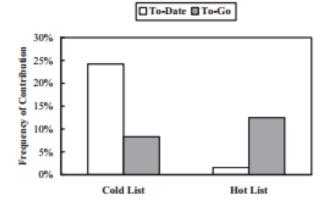


Figure 7. Charity contribution as a function of commitment certainty (cold list vs. hot list) and focus on to-date versus to-go information (Study 4).

 - Passengers waiting at the airport
 - Children in a daycare
 - Gym users

Home-run theoretical research

• Do:

- Be an expert on something.
- Pursue your expertise (explore similar topics across papers)
- (even though publishing the follow up paper will be more difficult)

Don't:

Mainly seize the opportunity

Crafting ideas for maximum persuasive impact

• Do:

- Ask: is it important? Is it interesting? Is it novel?
 (because this paper will take 7 time longer than your think).
- Communication skills matter. Your data doesn't speak for itself.
- Be original (easier said than done).
