Course Choices and Other Program Information for Exchange Students

The electives list for the fall 2013 exchange period will be made available at the beginning of May 2013 but as a reference, the electives list of the 2012 fall period can be requested from your home school coordinator. Around 70 elective courses are available to choose from.

Learning Expectations & Course Load

Students set up their own course schedule based on the requirements they need to meet at their home institution. Students must be aware that access to certain elective courses will be limited and that they are not automatically assured a place in all of the courses that they have selected. 140 sessions are the maximum amount of electives that can be taken at IE (1 session = 1.5 contact hours).
