



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What is GIM as a Class?

- 23-year-old experiential learning opportunity
- Winter-quarter course focused on a broad overview of country or region
- 12 days in-country business meetings, project research, and culture
- Opportunity to produce a business plan, case, industry analysis
- Working in teams
- A low-risk way to find out if you are interested in international business or working in a particular country
- Not tourism and not inexpensive
- Traveling with ~35 other people





What is GIM as Leadership Opportunity?

- Working on a team with Kellogg administrators, faculty, and your peers
- With the help and oversight of your advisor:
 - Determining the in-country components of your GIM class
 - Successfully implementing a twelve-day, international business education trip
 - Being responsible for the safety and well-being of all participants (within reason)
 - Overseeing a committee of fellow classmates to help with planning and implementation
- Building community in your GIM class
- A chance to network with international Kellogg alums
- A seven-month long commitment



A GIM Leadership Role is a Good Fit, if

you:

- Are detail-oriented and well-organized
- Are passionate about int'l business and/or the countries being studied
- Are comfortable being in a leadership role while traveling with peers
- Are able to consider the positions and needs of multiple stakeholders
- Are able to commit the time (7 months)





Student Leadership Roles

Leaders are pre-enrolled in GIM classes and do not have to spend bid points. This year, the Global Programs office also plans to cover 10% of leaders' travel costs.

- Plenary sessions and all the attendant work and research that goes along with it, like:
 - Target list of companies
 - Leveraging network and contacts
 - Scheduling
 - Prepping fellow students for sessions
