Course Choices and Other Program Information for Exchange Students

The electives list for the corresponding exchange period will be made available in approximately 2 months before the start of classes but as a reference, we provide interested candidates with the electives list of the past exchange period.

Learning Expectations & Course Load

Students set up their own course schedule based on the requirements they need to meet at their home institution. Students must be aware that access to certain elective courses will be limited and that they are not automatically assured a place in all of the courses that they have selected. 140 sessions are the maximum amount of electives that can be taken at IE (1 session = 1.5 contact hours).

Other requirements

All exchange students must currently be enrolled in an MBA or similar postgraduate program at one of IE's partner schools. Upon official nomination from your home school, students will receive a welcome email with access details to Campus Online and our long exchange website. In order to issue the visa-related letters as soon as possible, a data file, digital photo and CV need to be provided to IMBAExchange@ie.edu within the timeframe provided.
