KEYNOTE SPEAKER

D.G. Macpherson '96 MBA

Chairman and Chief Executive Officer W.W. Grainger, Inc. Chicago, Illinois

D.G. Macpherson was named chief executive officer and appointed to the board of directors of Grainger in October 2016. In 2017, he was named chairman of the board. He served as chief operating officer for Grainger from August 2015 through September 2016.

Prior to these roles, Macpherson was senior vice president and group president of global supply chain and international. He led the development of corporate strategy and continuous improvement, the global supply chain organization, the company's single-channel online business model and its international operations in Asia and Europe. Prior to that, he was senior vice president and president of global supply chain and corporate strategy.

Macpherson joined Grainger in 2008 from the Boston Consulting Group (BCG), where, from 2002-2008, he was partner and managing director. In that capacity, he served as a consultant to Grainger on several strategic and operational efforts, including availability improvement, pricing strategy, product line expansion and sales force effectiveness. At BCG, Macpherson was a member of the industrial goods leadership team with strong experience in production systems and continuous improvement methodologies. Early in his career, he was an operations manager for irrigation manufacturer Rain Bird Corporation and a test engineer with the U.S. Air Force.

Macpherson holds a bachelor's degree from Stanford University and an MBA from Northwestern University's Kellogg School of Management. He serves on the board of trustees of the Griffin Museum of Science and Industry (GMSI), where he chairs the exhibits and collections committee. He also serves as vice chair of the Civic Committee of Chicago.
