Professor Robert Hughes describes a **battle rhythm** as the cadence or pace your leadership team sets for making decisions and sharing information. As your organization moves forward, consider the following questions to build your battle rhythm with intent and purpose.

- How does your leadership team share and manage knowledge? How are decisions made?
- How does your leadership team assess situations and plan for the future?
- How does your leadership team establish meetings for a specific purpose?
- How is your leadership team coordinating and working with staff outside of meeting times? How do you create space for healthy task-based conflict?
- What is your leadership team's process for ensuring the right attendees are included?
